### Life Together—September 2011

Dear Friends,

September is here! With it comes the startup of many good things in our life together at Christ Church Lutheran. Here is a look at what this month is bringing to us.

- **Welcome to our new vicar, Will Starkweather, and his wife, Molly Wright Starkweather.** Will starts on September 1 and will be with us half-time—about 20 hours a week. His office is in the orange room. He's eager to meet you and to get involved in pastoral work here. Molly has an MA in English literature and teaches at St. Cloud State. There will be a Q&A time with Will after worship on the second Sunday in September.
- **Welcome Sunday is September 11.** We will commemorate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 9/11 with remembrance and prayers for the healing of our nation and the nations of the world. Following worship, during the coffee hour, there will be a time for welcoming new and long-time friends.
- **Adult forums resume on Sunday, September 18, at 11:10 a.m.** We will welcome renowned scholars of Muslim-Christian relationships—Adil Ozdemir, of the University of St. Thomas, on September 18, and Charles Amjad-Ali, of Luther Seminary, on September 25. Bring a friend to these timely adult forums that will explore our common ground as Muslims and Christians.
- **The celebration of our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary continues.** Following worship on Sunday, September 18, we will take an all-congregation photo outside on the front lawn. We want to document how good we're looking at 100 years old! (The rain date for the photo is Sunday, September 25.) Also, save the following dates for our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration—a dinner on Saturday, November 19, and worship with Dr. Martin Marty preaching on Sunday, November 20.
- **Sunday school for children and youth.** Watch the Sunday worship bulletins for word about the start of Sunday school and youth programs.
- **New room arrangements.** Our nursery is upstairs, located next to the family-friendly restroom in the education wing. If you come to worship with young children and need the nursery, you are welcome to use the door at the front of the sanctuary—on the pulpit side—to get to and from the nursery. You're invited to sit toward the front on the pulpit side, too. We welcome children to worship! For September and October, adult forums will be in the classroom behind the upstairs nursery, giving us forum space on the main floor of the church. The seating will be our comfortable molded chairs and PowerPoint works well in this classroom. The Luther lounge will be available for coffee and fellowship. Please give us your feedback on this arrangement.

I ask you to hold these things in your prayers and listen for how the Spirit is stirring you to be involved in them. You are a valued part of the ministry here. We are enriched by you and we pray that your participation in our life together deepens your faith, gives purpose and fullness to your life, and offers connections with others that bring you joy and rich relationship. I am very much looking forward to our ministries this fall—I hope you are, too, and that you will be a part of them!



The tower construction project is getting closer to being completed. It has gone well. When the project began, we had complaints from the neighborhood about dust and noise. The contractor has informed the Property Board that they are trying to finish by September 2. Xcel Energy will be moving the electric lines in the alley. By moving the lines, we can work on the chimney without an extended power outage.

July was one of the most humid months we have ever had. This caused high humidity problems in the lower level of the church and education building. The Property Board purchased more dehumidifiers; running them along with fans took care of the problem. Many thanks to the Property Board for their time and energy to improve the moisture problem. 

## Summary of Council Meeting Minutes from July 26, 2011

### Committee Reports

**Education:** Summer preschool program has been very successful; are planning the fall adult forum schedule—have received a \$1,000 donation for adult forum speakers; are planning fall Sunday school.

**Mission:** Served Our Saviour's Shelter meal last Monday; working on National Night Out (August 2) Longfellow Corn Feed (August 4).

**Property:** Fee increase request from MacDonald & Mack (discussed earlier).

**Stewardship:** Grace Duddy is working on stewardship.

**Worship:** Did not meet; no report

**Council at Large:** Visioning Committee has met with Elaine Weber-Nelson to plan and organize for the next steps.

**Treasurer's Report:** Envelope giving is behind budget by \$11,629.98. We need to figure out a plan to make up this difference in the next three months. Kevin and Pastor Carlson, with input from Melody, will meet to discuss the budget concerns. There was also discussion about fees that are charged for non-member weddings. Pastor Carlson will study this issue further.

Our vicar from Luther Seminary will be starting in September. Luther Seminary is paying one-half his salary and CCL is paying one-half—\$550 per month. This money will be taken from the Making a World of Difference budget, as well as the Buege Scholarship Fund. Pastor Carlson will check in with Luther Seminary re: the vicar.

**Organ Task Force:** Members of the Organ Task Force attended the council meeting to bring information on what the task force is considering; where they are in the decision-making process (how to make a decision on whether and how to pursue the offer of the Holtkamp organ). Kevin and task force members are in the process of developing a timeline for the organ project. Once a draft has been completed, it will be presented to the council for review.

At this time, the task force is not at the point of recommending a proposal to the council. There are many things to be considered, including the preservation aspect. They would like to contract with Elaine Weber-Nelson to obtain her guidance—perhaps through four to five hours of her time. The task force also requests approval to approach a small number of potential donors to assess their interest in donating money for a new organ.

Motion by Kevin; second by Rita: "The task force requests funding in the amount of up to \$500 of Ms. Weber-Nelson's consultation time. The task force also requests council approval to begin exploratory conversations with members and other interested parties related to project fundraising." Motion passed. Funding will come from the Organ Trust Fund.

### Pastor's Report

This month, I want to highlight some of the main projects I am involved with, helping to lead at Christ Church Lutheran—projects that are giving articulation and shape to the life of this community and to our future together:

- **The Visioning Committee.** Headed by Dan Mueller and Kevin Olsen, this committee has been meeting at least monthly and, in addition, meeting with the congregation and in its own subcommittees, to articulate the identity, vision, and mission of Christ Church Lutheran, and a mission strategy for living them out.
- **The Tower Project.** This has been an ongoing project for over a year now. Last summer, we were in the thick of *Reaching New Heights* and raising funds to match the generous grant we received from Saving America's Treasures. This summer, we are in actual construction mode, with workers on site every day, up on swing stages

to grind out the mortar and replace broken bricks on the Tower, and in other areas of the church. Gratitude to Darrell Anderson and the Property Committee for leading us so well in this project. I have been involved particularly with communications with the neighborhood and with those who are in our building during the week.

- **The Summer Preschool Program.** We are coming to the end of a very successful second season for our Summer Preschool Program. Great gratitude to Scott Krepsky, St. Olaf College Summer Vocational Intern, for being the lead teacher for two weeks and a helper for two other weeks. We have had up to 18 children participating each week in this program. The weeks have focused on: Vacation Bible School, Science, Music, and Art. Our other teachers have been Liz Karlen and Dana Gabriel. Helpers from the congregation include: Erik Haaland, Luann Skrivseth, Mary Lou Doll, Lucille Buelow, and myself. Our church secretary, Stephanie Okoneski, oversaw the registration. Each week, we have had parents fill out evaluation forms which have indicated much enthusiasm and appreciation for this program. Now we need to assess and hold conversations with these teachers and families to inform our next steps of outreach to them. We have made good connections this summer with these families.
- **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration.** This fall, we will move into the final stretch of our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary commemorations with the drawing of an icon, special forums, our stewardship campaign, All Saints, and the weekend of Christ the King Sunday when there will be a feast on Saturday and festival worship with Dr. Martin Marty preaching on Sunday morning. And then we will turn 101 and enter our next century of ministry and mission—a very exciting time!
- **The Organ Project.** A group of a dozen people has been considering proposals from Chris Holtkamp, organ designer and builder, as well as considering preservation issues involved in a new organ design, plus assessing our present organ, exploring other options, and exploring an approach to fundraising for this potential project.
- **Ongoing mentoring.** This summer, we have been truly blessed with Scott Krepsky, our St. Olaf College summer vocational intern. During the month of July, he has taken a lead position with our preschool—teaching and helping. In addition, he has been covering the church office for two weeks while Stephanie Okoneski is on vacation. During the month of August, he will be working closely with me in pastoral care, parish administration, and outreach. He is wonderful!

During the past month, I also presided at a wedding (Crystal Richardson and Keith Creech, July 16); met with a number of couples planning fall weddings; and presided at the funeral of Pearl Foss on Sunday, July 17, at 2:00 p.m. Thank you for the privilege and joy of being your pastor.

#### Old Business

**Preschool:** Discussed having conversations about visioning for the fall and reaching out to the preschool families.

**Tower Project:** Will probably go until the end of August; a neighborhood event will be held in September.

#### New Business

**MacDonald & Mack Architects:** Gene will contact Darrell Anderson for clarification regarding the letter from MacDonald & Mack requesting additional fees for the tower project. Council will vote on this in August or, if needed, the executive committee will meet before then.
