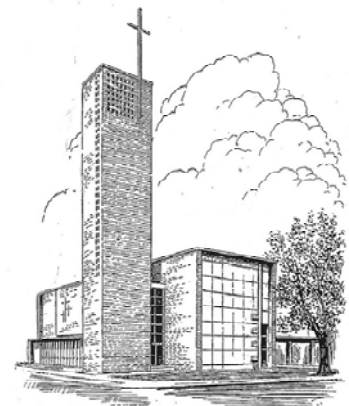
Mark your calendar for the three Advent services and meals—morning and evening—beginning Wednesday, November 30, and going through December 14. More information is provided on the front page.

Summary of Council Meeting Minutes from October 18, 2011

Committee Reports

Education and Youth: Upstairs nursery continues to be working out great; would like a speaker in the nursery to be able to listen to the church service. Sunday school student is attending adult forums. Youth trip will be attempted during spring break if workable with families. KidArt program will be held November 12, 2011; December 17, 2011; February 4, 2012; and March 17, 2012—led by Sally Messner and Christine Brand. Cabin Fever Saturdays, led by Liz Karlen, will be the second Saturday of January, February and March 2012. Education and Youth will coordinate the “Pick-up Christmas Pageant.”

Mission: Will be serving the meal at Our Saviour’s Shelter on October 31. Will be preparing a monthly meal for eight people at Safe House in St. Paul; first meal is scheduled for this Saturday.

Property: The electric wires in the alley needed to be moved twice. The first time they were moved, the wires were still too close to the chimney and needed to be moved a second time. The cross will be put back up tomorrow (October 19). Erik is painting the downstairs trim, hallways and stairways.

Stewardship: Pledge program concludes Sunday, October 30. A reminder to council members to submit pledges this Sunday, October 23.

Worship: A planning meeting was held September 25 to discuss fall worship projects.

100th Anniversary (Mary Bode): Council members were given a handout outlining the November 19 celebration and also a copy of the 100th anniversary budget. Two hundred seventy-five invitations have been sent out. Mary explained how the evening would proceed. Mary also stated that the 100th anniversary budget may be a little tight, but expressed hope that it will cover everything.

Treasurer’s Report: Council members reviewed the January–September 2011 profit & loss/budget vs. actual report and the CCL balance sheet September 30, 2011. Actual income is \$17,700 below what was budgeted. We did receive higher than average envelope contributions the first Sunday in October—\$8,000; average is \$3,000 per Sunday. Total operating expenses are approximately \$12,000 less than budgeted.

Pastor’s Report (submitted in writing)

Highlights from the past month include:

- Attending the Bishop’s Theological Conference at Heartwood Conference Center in NW Wisconsin (owned by Thrivent Financial), Sept. 25–27. Bishop Mark Hanson spoke several times and preached at the Eucharist worship service. He expressed confidence that the ELCA is more and more a healthy, missional church. These last years—since the vote to approve the ordination of gay and lesbian partnered candidates for ministry—have certainly been difficult times, he said, with a loss of congregations, with a loss of offerings to the wider church, and with a necessary and thorough restructuring of the church-wide offices. He also expressed sorrow that, in order to get to a renewed place of vision and energy, there have had to be such losses. Even so, his spirits were lively and full of hope for the future of the ELCA. Almost 200 clergy from the Minneapolis and St. Paul Area Synods attended this gathering. I am very grateful I was able to be there.
- At the Bishop’s Theological Conference, I also had a chance to welcome, on behalf of Christ Church Lutheran, our new interim bishop, Glenn Nycklemoe, who was my bishop when I served in the SE MN Synod.
- Conversation about the election process for our next bishop—at the Theological Conference and at our local pastors’ conference meeting. It is an ecclesiastical ballot, so there are no nominations ahead of time. However, there will be a Ministerium on November 10 at St. Stephen’s in Bloomington, where three former

bishops will speak about the work and needed gifts of a bishop. There is also talk about having such an event for lay people to attend. The Synod Assembly to elect the next bishop is February 17–18, 2012, at Shepherd of the Lake in Prior Lake; two voting members from Christ Church (a man and a woman) will attend as well as the pastor and vicar.

- Working with our vicar, Will Starkweather, to grow our relationship and to help him find his way into ministry and leadership here. What a joy to have Vicar Starkweather!
- Hospital visits and pastoral care visits.
- Three weddings—three weekends in a row—for couples not otherwise associated with our church. Thanks to our cantors; to our wedding coordinator, Joanne Seltz; and to Chuck Merrell and Stephanie Okoneski for their fine work. We continue to assess this outreach for its impact on the staff and its effectiveness both as a ministry and as a financial endeavor.
- Meeting with our Altar Guild, Oct. 2, led so very well by Lucille Buelow. I have ordered a new alb (my first since 1980!) to wear in time for our 100th anniversary.
- Continued work on: our stewardship program with Grace Duddy, chair; our visioning process with Dan Mueller and Kevin Olsen; our 100th anniversary planning with Mary Bode, Karen Woestehoff, and our cantors; our organ project, headed by Erik Haaland; and adult forums for 2012, with Josh Messner.
- A visit on Oct. 4 from Dena Sanford and Mark Chavez of the Omaha office of the National Park Service—the group that works with us as a National Historic Landmark and that helped us receive our matching grant for Reaching New Heights. People from the congregation met with them to discuss our tower project, a future courtyard and accessibility project, and the organ project.
- A wonderful and renewing week's vacation with my husband, visiting our youngest son at Vassar College and enjoying some days in my hometown, NYC. Thank you for the gift of re-creation. And thank you to everyone who provided leadership and ministry in my absence: Vicar Starkweather, Erik Haaland, Rev. Gordon Braatz, Sally Messner, Stephanie Okoneski, Chuck Merrell. And thanks to Taylor Brorby for staying with Saga!

Old Business

Priority List: To follow up from our September meeting that a priority list be created for long-range planning; we discussed who should be involved in creating this list, including the Property Board, Preservation Committee and the Friends of CCL. The Preservation Committee and the Friends of CCL have met regarding this matter. Will Stark is working with the Preservation Committee on obtaining a grant for an assessment of our needs.

Organ Project: The organ committee has met twice since the last council meeting. They have met with the Park Service and the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO); have had conversations with Chris Holtkamp and with Steve Edwins. They are still working on the design of the organ and how it can be modified, so it would be approved by the SHPO. The organ committee will be presenting at the adult forum on December 4.

New Business

Synod Assembly: All-day assemblies on February 17 and 18, 2012, at Shepherd of the Lake Lutheran Church in Prior Lake. CCL may send two lay voting members (one male, one female) and one youth lay voting member. Deadline for early-bird registration is January 5, 2012.
