Worship services will be at 11:30 a.m., followed by a noon lunch, and 7:00 p.m., preceded by a 6:00 p.m. supper.

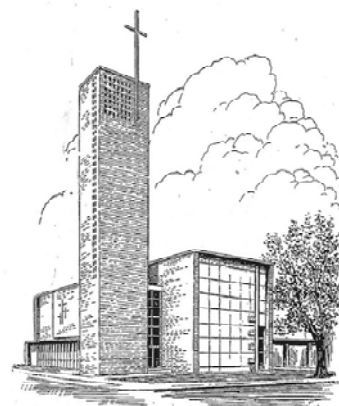
Retirees: No Meeting

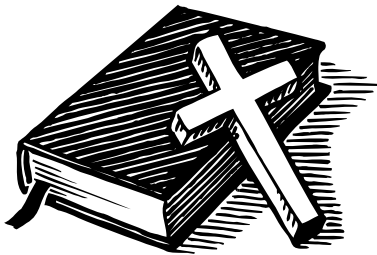

We will focus on the Gospel of John, featured this church year in the lectionary. For more information on all winter sessions, pick up an adult forum brochure or see the *Weekly Schedule* page on the church website—where you also can find pre-reading materials.

March 4. Pastor Carlson helps us sink deeply in the Passion narrative in the Gospel of John as we prepare to hear this story in worship and as we prepare to hear a local performance of Bach's *Saint John Passion*.

March 11. Paul Westermeyer, professor of church music and cantor at Luther Seminary, leads a discussion of J. S. Bach's life, vocation and cultural context, with reflections on Bach's musical and theological importance and the significance of his cantatas.

March 18. Paul Westermeyer returns to help us hear and understand Bach's music in new ways. Bach's *Saint John Passion* serves as a central part of the discussion.

March 24. Please join us this Saturday evening for a performance of Bach's monumental *Saint John Passion*. Summary of Council Meeting Minutes from February 21, 2012

Committee Reports

Education: The education committee has decided to meet quarterly and will provide quarterly reports.

Mission: March is food month and will be a busy one for the mission committee. Food donations are always needed. Currently, monetary donations are needed to reimburse members for shelter meal spending.

- Michael attended the February meeting of the Longfellow Community ecumenical ministerium about food resources. The goal was to help charitable givers distinguish between the various organizations in the area to better maximize donations. This group is meeting in March at CCL.
- Volunteers are needed through the summer to help with shelter work. A back-up lead cook is needed for each quarterly meal that we organize (third Monday of the first month of each quarter) at Our Saviour's Housing.

Property: No report. Currently seeking a chair.

Stewardship: The stewardship committee will present an adult forum in April on stewarding our spiritual gifts. The committee continues research in planning for the 2012–2013 stewardship program.

Worship: The committee has held two meetings this year, both to plan for Lenten/Triduum worship. Midweek Lenten worship will be centered on the Psalms. The Easter flower garden campaign is starting.

Council at Large: No report.

Treasurer's Report: Both income and expenses were less than budgeted in January, leaving an operating surplus of \$1,284 for the month. January was a good month for investments; Thrivent earnings were strong.

- The success of the *Good Design Is Forever* event moved the Finlandia Foundation to give Christ Church \$1,000 in gratitude for our hospitality.
- Memorial gifts of \$2,000 were received in January.

Pastor's Report

- January 22: Twenty members of Christ Church Lutheran traveled to Saint Olaf in Northfield to participate in a Holtkamp organ demonstration with Dr. John Ferguson.
- January 28: *Good Design Is Forever*, a celebration of Finnish culture and design at Christ Church; more than 1,000 people came to tour the sanctuary and see exhibits.
- February 4 and 11, respectively: A third KidArt Saturday with two dozen children and a second Cabin Fever Saturday with almost 40 children and parents.
- February 4–5: A weekend away for me; thanks to Vicar Starkweather for preaching and to Pastor Farlee for presiding.
- February 6: Accordo concert, more than 300 chamber music fans in our sanctuary.
- February 17–18: Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly elected new bishop Rev. Ann Svennungsen; resounding vote against the Marriage Amendment.
- February 19: Annual Meeting followed by Mardi Gras Party in Concordia room and discussion with Chris Holtkamp about potential new organ for Christ Church; continued visits throughout winter to assess potential gifts to finance new organ.
- Looking ahead: March 8–15, week of vacation; March 22–24, Music That Makes Community, conference on leading worship hosted by Christ Church; March 24, Bach's Saint John Passion performance; April 1–8, Holy Week; April 9–18, continuing education trip to Finland with Minneapolis Institute of Arts.

Vicar's Report (submitted in writing)

- I continue to be blessed with opportunities to preach, assist in worship and sing in the choir. I preached on February 5 on the healing of Simon's mother-in-law; also attended worship planning meetings to prepare for Lenten worship and celebration of the Three Days.
- Confirmation classes are a joy. I am grateful for Daniel Rinehart's able assistance in lesson planning and teaching; pastoral care visits continue.
- February 17–18: Attended Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly. While not a voting delegate, I was grateful for insight into the synod's operations and the chance to observe the election of a new bishop.
- Update on the other half of my time: Spring semester classes have begun at Luther Seminary. Mine include Gospel and Epistles of John, Ministry with Persons with Mental Illness and Their Families, and Money and the Mission of the Church.

Old Business

Organ Project Report: The organ project task force is looking for a chairperson to replace Erik Haaland. We are moving forward this winter with Steve Edwins to create three-dimensional graphics of the organ proposal.

Visioning Report: The visioning committee's activities were reported in full at the congregational meeting and will be the focus of a church council retreat this Saturday, February 25.

New Business

Historical Structures Report: Will Stark's report from the congregational meeting was reviewed briefly. The grant money will stay with the Friends of CCL budget, so it will not be part of the church budget.

General Council Meeting Processes: Council approved a plan to reduce paper usage for council meetings. Council also agreed to approve minutes of regular meetings within a day or two of the meeting in order to meet *Courier* printing deadlines and to provide the congregation with information in a more timely manner.

Guest Speaker April 22


The Rev. Dr. Frederick Niedner, Professor of Theology at Valparaiso University, is coming to Christ Church Lutheran on Sunday, April 22, as a 100th anniversary guest. He is the grandson of Pastor Friedrich Niedner, the first full-time pastor of Christ Church.

Dr. Niedner will preach at our 9:30 a.m. worship service and will bring some family archives to share during coffee fellowship. He also will teach the adult forum that morning. His session is titled "How Do You Know a Resurrected Person When You See One?" and will address how the four Gospels respond to questions about Jesus' resurrection and what this means for us.



The forum will start promptly at 11:10 a.m. Dr. Niedner will talk briefly about his grandfather before beginning the Bible study. We hope you can join us for the entire morning!
